All places we go to are free and travel is by public transport so there should be no cost for outing provided you bring your Freedom Pass. We suggest you also bring sandwiches, which we find somewhere to have together.

Oct	2 nd	Morden Hall Park and Garden Centre 125 acres of parkland with the River Wandle running through it. The park is criss-crossed with walks, and footbridges over the river. 	16 th	National Archives exhibition Protect and Survive: Britain's Cold War Revealed This exhibition explores the impact of the Cold War on Britain, from the corridors of power and hidden government bunkers to daily life in the home. 	23 rd	Beckenham Place Park New park opened in July 2019. Includes mansion containing café/toilets. https://www.lewisham.gov.uk/inmyarea/openspaces/parks/beckenham-place-park
	30 th	Honeywood Museum Grade II listed building next to the picturesque Carshalton Ponds in the heart of Carshalton's historic Conservation Area. Surrounded by historic buildings and water features the locality forms one of the most interesting and attractive areas in Greater London. Nov	6 th	BAFTA Piccadilly: Behind the Screens exhibition celebrates the creativity and talent of BAFTA winners and nominees from the past 75 years. Includes café. https://baftapiccadilly.co.uk/
	13 th	Bank of England Museum: An exhibition celebrating the Bank of England's 325th anniversary through 325 objects. https://www.bankofengland.co.uk/museum

	20 th	Visit to Trinity Buoy Wharf Docklands site for artistic and cultural activities located in London's Docklands area, about one mile East of Canary Wharf. The site is the home of London's only lighthouse which is no longer operational but part of the arts buildings. London's first Container City, old shipping containers decorated and transformed into coveted studios and apartments is built on the site http://www.trinitybuoywharf.com/
	27 th	The Faraday Museum This grand building just off Piccadilly has been home to 14 Nobel prizewinners, and housed the laboratories of some of the world's greatest scientific minds. The small but entertaining exhibition explores the illustrious history of the Royal Institution, and uses animations and comedy to explain some of the groundbreaking concepts and equipment on show. https://www.rigb.org/visit-us/faraday-museum

	11 th	Visit to St. Katharine Docks Iconic St Katharine Docks is Central London's only marina and has evolved into a thriving waterside. Opening in 1828, the Thomas Telford-designed dock was once one of the busiest ports in the UK, renowned for handling luxury goods, sugar, rum, spices, perfumes, wines and tea. http://www.skdocks.co.uk/
	18 th	Charlton House Greenwich London's best example of Jacobean architecture. Grade one listed and showcases brilliant examples of Jacobean plaster work on ceilings, marble fireplaces and walled peace gardens featuring 3 beautiful gardens.
