Jan 2020	8 th	Hogarth House contains an extensive collection of prints and engravings by the artist William Hogarth. The house was his country home and has been restored to tell the history of his life and the building. 	15 th	Science Museum - Medicine: The Wellcome Galleries New home for the most significant medical collections in the world. Showcasing extraordinary medical artefacts from the collections of Henry Wellcome and the Science Museum Group, including the world's first MRI scanner, Fleming's penicillin mould, a professional pianist's prosthetic arm and even robotic surgery equipment, the galleries explore our relationship with medicine and health through more than 500 years of history. https://www.sciencemuseum.org.uk/see-and-do/medicine-wellcome-galleries
	22 nd	Vestry House Museum presents the history of Waltham Forest. Situated in Walthamstow Village, the Grade II listed building used to house the parish workhouse, and was later a police station and private home. It now contains themed displays capturing the heritage of the local area and includes the famous Bremer Car, a Victorian parlour, costume gallery and wonderful display of locally manufactured toys and game https://vestryhousemuseum.org.uk/
	29 th	Natural History Museum the natural world, its history and specimens. It has a large collection of over 80,000 species and objects related to the natural world. It is the most visited natural history museum in Europe https://www.nhm.ac.uk/
Feb	5 th	Bethlem Museum of the Mind Beckenham Based in the original 'Bedlam', this small but important museum contains historic and contemporary pieces by artists who have suffered from a mental disorder. https://museumofthemind.org.uk/
	12 th	Tate Britain holds the largest collection of British art in the world. Walk through the history of British art from 1500 to the present day. See masterpieces by JMW Turner, John Constable, John Everett Millais, as well as outstanding modern and contemporary art from Francis Bacon, Lucian Freud, Barbara Hepworth, David Hockney and Bridget Riley https://www.tate.org.uk/visit/tate-britain

	19 th	The Museum of Methodism and John Wesley's House tells the history of Methodism from John Wesley to the present day and its contribution to shaping Britain's political and social history. John Wesley's House stands next to the Chapel. It was his home for over a decade and is one of the finest surviving small Georgian townhouses in London. https://www.wesleysheritage.org.uk
	26 th	Two Temple Place Hidden Fabric: Women; Textiles; Collectors Exhibition highlighting exceptional textiles held in seven regional museum collections in England, all originally collected in the twentieth century by pioneering women. https://twotempleplace.org/exhibitions/hidden-fabric/
Mar	4 th	Victoria and Albert Museum – Cast Collection Opened in 1873, the Cast Courts display copies of some of the world's most significant works of art reproduced in plaster, electrotype, photography, and digital media. The cast collection is famous for including reproductions of Michelangelo's David, Trajan's Column, and Ghiberti's Gates of Paradise, amongst many others https://www.vam.ac.uk/collections/cast-collection
	11 th	The British Library Current exhibitions include William Wordsworth. Delve into the writing, life and legacy of one of Britain's most famous poets in the 250th anniversary year of his birth. 	18 th	The Horniman Museum in Forest Hill is a free museum with extensive collections of anthropology, natural history and musical instruments. Includes café and shop. https://www.horniman.ac.uk/
	25 th	Bourne Hall Museum Ewell. Situated in the heart of Ewell Village, is a remarkable modern building of unusual architectural interest, surrounded by beautiful grounds.. The Museum charts the Borough's history through its collections of document and picture archives, fine art, costume, archaeology and social history.
